Campus Information

Hiring Dept. Information

The College of Education is seeking applicants for the Special Education with a Specialization in Autism Spectrum Disorder position at the rank of Assistant Professor. This position is housed in the Teaching Credentials branch (Academic and Program Services) in the College of Education. The College of Education has a genuine commitment to developing scholars and practitioners who recognize that we live and work in diverse linguistic, racial, gender, economic, and religious institutions and communities,

and also understand the need to TEACH for Change. The College offers a Bachelors degree, P/K- 16 Teaching, Counseling, and Administrative Credentials, Masters and Doctoral degrees in Education.

The College prepares future teachers and other educational professionals to work effectively with diverse populations, as well as students with special needs. Candidates/graduates are prepared to assume leadership roles with respect to advocating for educational equity and social justice in education at all levels. The programs' sequenced and integrated design results in highly focused instruction interwoven with hands-on teaching experiences, sustained mentoring, and personalized advising. The faculty work closely together, and the program curriculum features courses that are collaboratively developed and may be co-taught. Faculty have close professional relationships with local P/K-12 and higher educational institutions, community and governmental organizations/institutions throughout the Sacramento region. Faculty members provide academic and professional support to local programs, teachers, administrators, counselors, as well as, engage in collaborative or joint research, scholarly projects, presentations, and professional development related activities.

A successful California State University, Sacramento faculty member promotes the values celebrated by a public, regional, comprehensive, metropolitan university. At Sacramento State, the quality of the education we provide is our top priority. In addition to contributing positively to teaching and learning, faculty members are expected to engage in scholarship and to provide service to the University and to the greater community. Our campus community represents the broad diversity of our state, and we believe that all are enriched and unified by this diversity. In that spirit, we are particularly interested in receiving applications from a broad spectrum of qualified people with the commitment and ability to work with a diverse student population.

Duties/Responsibilities

- Teach four courses (or equivalent) each semester in credential- and graduate-level programs.
- Ability to teach courses focused on evidence-based practices for supporting students with mild/moderate disabilities and autism spectrum disorder in inclusive environments, collaborating with other educators, engaging families and care providers. Co-plan and co-teach with faculty instructional teams.
- Teach and develop other courses in areas of specialization.
- The teaching schedule will include days and evenings, and may include weekends.
- Provide leadership in developing credential and graduate courses.
- Supervise candidates in the field.
- Advise candidates in culminating experiences.
- Advise and recruit students.
- Engage in scholarly activities (publications, presentations, etc.).
- Provide service to the institution (including serving on programmatic, college-wide and University-wide committees).
- Provide service to the community.

Qualifications

REQUIRED:

- Earned doctorate in Education with an emphasis on special education with mild/moderate disabilities and a specialization in autism spectrum disorder. ABD candidates will be considered. If ABD, candidates will be required to complete the doctorate by August 2017.

Special Knowledge and Abilities:

- Knowledge of methodologies to support the learning of students with mild/moderate disabilities, collaborate with other educators, and engage families and care providers.
- Knowledge of the legal and historical aspects of public education and services to students with disabilities.
- Knowledge of inclusive service delivery models for students with mild/moderate disabilities and autism spectrum disorder.
- Knowledge of research findings related to autism spectrum disorder.
- Knowledge of evidence-based interventions, accommodations, and program supports optimal for children on the autism spectrum.
- Ability to teach to students in undergraduate, credential, and graduate programs.

Experience:

- Knowledge, understanding or teaching students with mild/moderate disabilities and autism spectrum disorder.
- Knowledge of and experience with students from diverse cultures.
- Experience teaching in urban public (P/K-12) schools settings, serving English language learners, or youth from diverse communities and cultural backgrounds.
- Experience with using instructional technologies to enhance student learning.

PREFERRED:

- Knowledge of social-emotional learning theories and practices and how to embed them into instruction for students with mild/moderate disabilities.
- Knowledge and experience supporting students with emotional disturbance, as well as experience with different modes of instructional delivery using technology (i.e. teaching learners at a distance, flipped classrooms).
- Knowledge of research-based curriculum models for urban K-12 students with mild/moderate disabilities and autism spectrum disorder.
- Experience with methodologies of teaching English language learners with/without mild/moderate disabilities and autism spectrum disorder.
- Teaching experience with credential candidates.

Appointment

This is a tenure-track position at the Assistant Professor rank. Salary is dependent upon qualifications and professional experience.

Candidate will be required to provide official transcripts of their highest degree earned and must furnish proof of eligibility to work in the U.S.
