Why Race and Culture Matter in Schools: Closing the Achievement Gap in America's Classrooms

Dr. Tyrone Howard is on the faculty in the division of Urban Schooling in the Graduate School of Education and Information Studies at UCLA. Best known for his scholarship on race, culture, and education, Dr. Howard is one of the most renowned scholars on educational equity, the African American educational experience, and urban schools.

Professor Howard has authored more than 50 peer-reviewed

journal articles, book chapters, and other academic publications and reports. He has delivered more than 75 keynote addresses and presented more than 150 research papers, workshops, and symposia at national and international conferences on equity, achievement gap, race, culture, Black males, and urban experiences.
