THE UNIVERSITY: California State University, East Bay is known for award-winning programs, expert instruction, a diverse student body, and a choice of more than 100 career-focused fields of study. The ten major buildings of the Hayward Hills campus, on 342 acres, contain over 150 classrooms and teaching laboratories, over 177 specialized instructional rooms, numerous computer labs and a library, which contains a collection of over one million items. The University also has campuses in Concord and Oakland, as well as Online. With an enrollment of over 15,000 students and approximately 900 faculty, CSUEB is organized into four colleges: Letters, Arts, and Social Sciences; Business and Economics; Education and Allied Studies; and Science. The University offers bachelor's degrees in 47 fields, minors in 51 fields, master's degrees in 33, 12 certificate options, and 1 doctoral degree program. <http://www20.csueastbay.edu/> All California State University campuses, including CSUEB, became smoke and tobacco-free effective September 1, 2017.

THE DEPARTMENT: The Department of Teacher Education offers the Multiple Subject Teaching Credential and the Single Subject Teaching Credential in Art, English, History/Social Studies, Mathematics (all areas including Advanced), Music, Physical Education, Science (General and Integrated) and Languages Other Than English (Hindi, French and Spanish). The Department offers a Master's of Science (MS) degree in Education with four options: Curriculum, Educational Technology Leadership, Reading Instruction, and Early Childhood Education. DUTIES OF THE POSITION: The candidate must possess the ability to teach Educational Foundations courses in both the Multiple Subject (elementary) and Single Subject (secondary) credential programs. Courses focus on psychological foundations of education with an emphasis on application of learning principles for students, including in multicultural settings; instruction, and planning. Candidate must also be able to teach educational research methods in the curriculum and early childhood education Master's programs. In addition to teaching, all faculty must be able to supervise candidates in field practicum and assume roles and responsibilities as a member of the Department of Teacher Education. Please note that teaching assignments at California State University, East Bay include courses at the Hayward, Concord and Online campuses. In addition to teaching, all faculty have advising responsibilities, are to assist the department with administrative and/or committee work, and are expected to assume campus-wide committee responsibilities.

RANK AND SALARY: Assistant Professor. Salary is dependent upon educational preparation and experience. Subject to budgetary authorization.

DATE OF APPOINTMENT: Fall Semester, 2018

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QUALIFICATIONS: Candidate must have an earned doctorate in a field appropriate to the position, for example Educational Psychology, Reading, Instructional Methods, Research Methodology or related field. Applicants who are ABD will be considered, but a successful ABD candidate must complete all requirements for the doctorate by the effective date of the appointment. Candidates must possess 2-3 years teaching experience in a pk-12 setting. Candidates with successful teaching experience at the university level are preferred. Knowledge of teacher preparation in California preferred. Candidate must have a defined research agenda with outline of future publications.

Additionally, experience with one or more of the following preferred: socio-emotional learning, Restorative Justice, assessment, TK-12 literacy, early childhood education, history/social studies, and/or health/physical education. These added areas of expertise are driven by the new standards being implemented and areas of content expertise that are not currently covered by a full-time faculty.

Candidates should demonstrate experience in teaching, mentoring, research, or community service that has prepared them to contribute to our commitment to diversity and excellence. Additionally, applicants must demonstrate a record of scholarly activity. Selected applicants will be asked to submit official transcripts at a later date, along with three (3) signed letters of professional recommendation.
