Instructors are expected to attend all class sessions, read and evaluate student assignments, and assign grades adhering to all department deadlines. Additionally, instructors are expected to attend all program faculty meetings, faculty retreats, and participate in accreditation activities to help meet California Accreditation for our program.

Qualifications:

- Masters degree in Education or related field at the time of application
- Written and spoken fluency in Spanish
- Minimum of one quarter/semester of teaching experience at the college level by the time of appointment
- Preferred: Experience working in teacher education or K-12 education with BCLAD
- Preferred: Familiarity with the California Standards for the Teaching Profession (CSTP) and Teacher Performance Expectations (TPE)
- Preferred: Experience teaching in a bilingual K-12 school
