The Graduate School of Education at California Lutheran University invites applications for a tenure-track position at the Assistant Professor level in special education teacher preparation beginning Fall, 2016. The successful candidate will teach graduate-level courses as well as maintain a focus on continuous improvement in the area of student learning outcomes, curriculum development, advising and research. Candidates for this position must possess an earned doctorate in Special Education or related field by August, 2016. In addition, the candidate must have a record of supporting students with disabilities in K12 settings, experience with promising practices in inclusion, and experience working with culturally and linguistically diverse populations of students. The candidate must be able to demonstrate a developing agenda of research and scholarship.
