

Job Ad for Joint Faculty Tenure-line position in the Departments of Elementary and Secondary Education, History/Social Sciences and Literacy

The Departments of Elementary Education and Secondary Education at San Francisco State University invite applicants for a tenure-track Assistant or Associate Professor joint position in the teaching of History/Social Science and Literacy beginning August 2016.

The Departments seek a tenure-track faculty member with the knowledge and abilities in History/Social Science and Literacy to prepare K-12 teachers and MA candidates, and undertake research that supports the development of teachers to work in culturally and linguistically diverse classroom environments.

The Department of Secondary Education offers single subject credential programs across eight content areas for future middle and high school teachers. The Department also offers MA programs in Secondary Education and Math Education (joint with Elementary Education). Faculty in the Secondary Education Department work closely with our local school districts providing equity-and standards-based professional development.

The Department of Elementary Education offers a Multiple Subject Teaching Credential Program for future elementary and middle school teachers, and MA Programs in Early Childhood Education, Elementary Education, Language and Literacy, and Math Education (joint with Secondary Education). The department also features a bilingual Multiple Subject Teaching Credential Program and faculty collaborate with local school districts in the areas of school reform and professional development.

Qualifications:

- A Ph.D. or Ed. D. in Education from an accredited program with an specialization in History/Social Science. Candidates should have extensive K-12 experience in the teaching and learning of History/Social Science, with additional experience in literacy, desired.
- Candidates must demonstrate the ability to teach courses in the areas of K-12 History/Social Science and Literacy in the Graduate College of Education's Secondary Education Department and Elementary Education Department.
- Candidates should demonstrate evidence of preparing teachers to teach students with diverse cultural and linguistic backgrounds, a record of scholarship, and the ability to use technology in teaching and learning.
- Candidates must have an active record of scholarship related to their specialty area and evidence of external support or the potential for external funding of these activities, commensurate with their tenure status. Excellence in teaching and scholarship must be demonstrated at the K-12 level.
- Candidates are preferred who have teaching and/or research experience with a large, diverse student body. Candidates are preferred who have knowledge and

experience with culturally responsive instructional practices and theories in K-12 public school settings.

Responsibilities: The position requires teaching (credential and MA) in the Department of Elementary Education and the Department of Secondary Education, supervising credential students, and advising MA students, developing an active ongoing scholarship program in History/Social-Science and Literacy, and ongoing committee and service assignments. Rank and salary: Assistant or Associate Professor. Salary commensurate with qualifications and experience. The CSU provides generous health, retirement and other benefits.
