

### **Assistant Professor, Tenure-Track, Secondary Math Education**

Saint Mary's College of California invites applications for a full-time tenure-track position beginning in fall 2017 for a mathematics educator in the Single Subject Credential Program in the Kalmanovitz School of Education at the Assistant Professor level.

We seek a scholar-practitioner with experience teaching secondary mathematics, preferably in urban settings, who can collaborate with teacher credential faculty across the disciplines and contribute to the Master of Arts in Teaching program. Applicants with scholarly and practice-based experience in the preparation of ethnically, linguistically, and socioeconomically diverse students are strongly encouraged to apply. This might be demonstrated through the integration of culturally relevant pedagogical practices and a stance on the implementation of anti-racist education within the mathematics classroom.

The Kalmanovitz School of Education is a student-centered learning community that inspires innovation in counseling, education, and leadership. Through the practice of shared inquiry, active and collaborative learning, and learning through service to society, we empower our students to deliver excellence and lead change according to the principles of social justice. The school is known for partnerships emphasizing community engagement, action research, and community-based research, and it is known for its strength in environmental education, Catholic education, and urban education.

Consistent with Saint Mary's College's commitment to inclusive excellence, the Single Subject Credential Program strives to be an inclusive community, committed to a humanizing education that fosters respect and belonging for faculty and students of diverse backgrounds and identities. We seek a candidate who can engage, advocate for and support students of color, women, and underrepresented groups as they prepare to become teachers AND support students who do not identify in these ways as they prepare to engage as teachers in culturally enriched communities. We urge those with urban education experience to apply.

## RESPONSIBILITIES:

All Saint Mary's faculty are invited to engage with and contribute to the Catholic, Lasallian and Liberal Arts traditions of the College through their teaching, scholarship, and service. The standard teaching load is six courses per year or the credit equivalent. Single Subject faculty may elect to supervise a credential candidate in the field placement as part of their course load. There also is the opportunity to teach in the College's undergraduate Collegiate Seminar ("Great Books") Program and during January Term. All faculty are expected to engage in scholarly activity, advise students, assist with program development, and provide service to College and unit-level committees. In addition to teaching courses in the candidate's area of specialization, the successful candidate is expected to teach core courses in the Single Subject Program.

The Single Subject Program credentials secondary teachers of English, Social Studies, Mathematics, Science, Physical Education, Art, and Music. Core courses include Foundations of Secondary Education, general & subject area methods, Social, Psychological, and Cultural Foundations, Universal Access, Foundations of Adolescent Literacy, among others. The mission of the program is to prepare critical and reflective teacher leaders committed to social justice in partnership with our communities. The Teacher Education Department offers a Masters of Arts in Teaching, in collaboration with the Multiple Subject and Special Education programs.

Saint Mary's faculty are expected to maintain an active scholarly agenda and demonstrate intellectual growth and significant achievement appropriate to their field, including public presentation and peer review. All faculty also contribute service to the College and community, including academic advising, student and community outreach, and participation in the shared governance of the College through departmental and College-wide committees and the development and assessment of the College's Core Curriculum.

## QUALIFICATIONS

The successful candidate will demonstrate a record of teaching excellence in secondary mathematics (at least three years), preferably in urban schools or at schools that serve a majority of students who qualify for free/reduced lunch. Experience teaching students who are English learners and students with special needs in general education classrooms is strongly preferred. The candidate must be familiar with the Common Core State Standards in Mathematics. Experience with the integration of technology into mathematics teaching and learning is preferred. Candidates must have a strong commitment to research, student-centered teaching, and a desire to mentor credential students who will teach in diverse educational and cultural contexts
