The faculty of the College of Education at California State University Dominguez Hills invites applications for a tenure-track position of Assistant/Associate professor rank in the School and College Counseling Program, Division of Graduate Education.

Responsibilities

Duties include teaching graduate courses in the Master of Science in Counseling, School and College Counseling program and the California Pupil Personnel Services Credential program; providing program advisement to students; mentoring students in research and professional development; supervising students in counseling field experiences; expanding partnerships at local schools and colleges; assuming college and university committee responsibilities; developing, maintaining, and expanding a scholarly research and publication agenda pertaining to issues of Pre K-16 urban education; and collaborating with faculty on candidate and program assessment, and admissions reviews.

The School and College Counseling Program is one of four programs within the Division of Graduate Education in the College of Education. The vision of the College is to maintain a model of collaborative urban educational excellence. Qualifications

Minimum Qualifications

- Earned doctorate (Ed.D., Ph.D., or Psy.D.) in counseling, psychology, education, or a closely related field of study from an accredited university by date of appointment;

- Experience as professional counselor at either the School (PreK-12) or College level;
- Emerging record of successful college teaching and service to the profession and the community;
- Evidence of a promising program of research in counseling or in a closely related area
- Evidence of applied knowledge in several of the following areas: counseling theory and practice; group dynamics; individual, group, crisis, and career counseling; consultation and collaboration; educational leadership; counselor supervision; and law and ethics.
- Evidence of understanding urban education and commitment to the preparation of educational counselors to meet the needs of culturally and linguistically diverse populations of Southern California;
- Experience in teaching graduate students from diverse age, socioeconomic, cultural and academic backgrounds.

Preferred Qualifications

- Evidence of exemplary teaching at the college or university level - where appropriate as demonstrated by student evaluations;
- Experience as both a credentialed public School Counselor in a preK-12 setting and experience as a College Counselor, at either the community college or university setting.
- Expertise in providing clinical skills to PreK-16 students – where appropriate as demonstrated by the possession of clinical license or specialized certifications.
- An emerging or established record of scholarly publication in refereed journals;
- Experience working collaboratively to deliver graduate level curricula;
- Experience advising and mentoring graduate students;
- Experience in providing supervision to School or College Counselors;
- Experience in and a commitment to on-going program assessment of teaching and learning;
- Expertise in writing and implementing grants;
- Evidence of commitment to social justice issues.
