Responsibilities

Duties include:

- Teaching special education pedagogy, assessment, and typical/atypical development;
- Supervising student teachers and interns in field experiences across various special education settings;
- Evaluating the progress of candidates in programs leading to preliminary or clear credentials, added authorizations, or a MA in special education;
- Advising prospective and current candidates in group or individual settings on admission, program coursework, and graduation requirements of the various programs;
- Assuming department, college, and university committee responsibilities;
- Collaborating with staff and families in K-12 settings

- Fostering partnerships with University and local school districts and agencies where candidates complete their fieldwork requirements;
- Establishing and expanding a scholarly research and publication agenda pertaining to special education issues.

The Position

The Special Education Program seeks a person to be a full-time tenure track professor in the area of Special Education.

The Ideal Candidate

A successful candidate will have had experience teaching in PK-12 Special Education classrooms, an established research agenda, a history of publications in refereed journals, university experience, and program administrative experience.

Qualifications

Minimum Qualifications

- Earned doctorate (Ed.D. or Ph.D.) by date of appointment in special education or a closely related field with an emphasis in culturally responsive methodologies and/or literacy instruction
- Eligible for or holds an Education Specialist Mild/Moderate or equivalent Credential (added authorization in ELL/bilingual credential highly preferred)
- Experience as a teacher, or service provider in public K-12 special education settings working with culturally and linguistically diverse students including ELLs
- Understanding of and commitment to urban education and the preparation of special education candidates to meet the needs of culturally, linguistically, and ethnically diverse populations;
- Demonstrated ability and experience in working with culturally and linguistically diverse families
- Demonstrated proficiency in oral and written communication and interpersonal skills, including a willingness to work cooperatively with both students and colleagues;
- Evidence of effective teaching strategies in both traditional and technology mediated learning environments (e.g., hybrid or online teaching experience);
- Demonstrated leadership skills in establishing and maintaining effective working relationships with faculty, staff, other departments, students, and the public.
- Experience in teaching undergraduate or graduate students from diverse age, socioeconomic, cultural, and academic backgrounds.

Preferred Qualifications

- Fluent in spoken and written Spanish
- A strong research agenda/background in bilingual special education
- Experience with the delivery of special education learning experiences with dual language learners or English language learners
- Knowledge of effective reading practices and literacy instruction for K-12 settings
- Involvement with planning, assessing, and evaluating curricula
- Preference for experience with organizational leadership skills
- Practice in program administration

About the University

CSU Dominguez Hills holds the Carnegie classification of Master's L and is a federally recognized Hispanic-Serving Institution. Class sizes are small as compared with large research universities and classes are taught by the faculty, not by teaching assistants. Many of the university's students are the first in their families to earn a university degree. While the university enrolls traditional full-time students, many students enroll part-time and attend late afternoon, evening and weekend classes because of work and family responsibilities.

CSU Dominguez Hills offers 45 baccalaureate degrees, 24 master's degrees, and a number of certificate and credential programs. Enrollment exceeds 14,635 students, and the student population is among the most ethnically and culturally rich in the nation:

60% Hispanic/ Latino, 14.5% Black/ African-American, 10.9% White, 10.8% Asian, .10% American Indian/ Alaska Native, .30% Native Hawaiian/ Other Pacific Islander, 3.10% Two or more races.

The University is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC), the accrediting body for institutions of higher learning in the West. Twelve programs hold accreditations from national professional associations: business administration, clinical sciences, computer science, education, health science, music, nursing, occupational therapy, public administration, special education, theatre arts, and social work.

The academic programs of the university are organized under the Colleges of Arts and Humanities, Business Administration and Public Policy, Extended and International Education, Natural and Behavioral Sciences, Education, and Health and Human Services, and Nursing. While continuing to emphasize the liberal arts and sciences, professional programs offered at the undergraduate and graduate level, developed to serve the region's workforce needs, are of great interest to students and prepare them for professions in a variety of industries.

Known for excellence in teacher education, nursing, psychology, business administration, and digital media arts, new degree programs include computer science, criminal justice, recreation and leisure studies, social work, and communication disorders. CSU Dominguez Hills is a national leader in distance learning with 10 academic degrees and seven certificate programs offered.

Faculty

A tradition of teaching excellence lies at the heart of the university experience for Dominguez Hills' students. Most of the faculty have earned doctoral degrees from prestigious universities across the nation. The faculty strives to sustain a dynamic teaching and learning environment in a multicultural setting. The Academic Senate provides a forum for faculty, administration, students and others to be represented and consulted regarding such vital issues as budget priorities, academic standards, curriculum and instruction, and student affairs.

Student Life

At CSU Dominguez Hills, there's more to student life than the classroom. The university offers a dynamic, interactive and enriching community of learners, teachers and peers sharing diverse points of view. There are multitudes of ways for students to pursue interests, get involved, and get the most from their academic experience.

An office of student life enhances student development by coordinating a variety of co-curricular activities, including 60 student organizations. Students are encouraged to perform community service and participate in leadership development. The Multicultural Center on campus promotes the exploration of diverse heritages, values and cultural experiences by offering a wide range of activities and programs throughout the academic year.

CSU Dominguez Hills is a National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division II institution that competes in the California Collegiate Athletic Association (CCAA). CSU Dominguez Hills is one of the most athletically competitive and honored schools in the

CCAA, with 23 conference titles and four national championships to date, including the 2008 NCAA D-II Men's Soccer National Championship. CSU Dominguez Hills sponsors 11 intercollegiate athletic teams.

The Location

The university is located in Carson, California, in the South Bay region of Los Angeles County. Its 346-acre park-like campus is situated in the historic Rancho San Pedro, the oldest Spanish land grant in the Los Angeles area. The site remained in the continuous possession of the Dominguez family for seven generations - from its inception in 1794 to its acquisition by the state of California.

The Region

The South Bay is one of the most culturally, economically, and ethnically diverse areas in the United States, with a largely even distribution of the population with African, Asian/Pacific Islander, European, and Latino ancestry. The university is located in the city of Carson, a city of 93,000 residents and one of the many municipalities that border the city of Los Angeles. Cultural, performance and sports venues in downtown Los Angeles are about 15 minutes away and the South Bay beach communities are a few minutes away to the west and south. The StubHub, a 125-acre sports center developed by AEG and home to Major League Soccer's L.A. Galaxy and Chivas USA, is located on the CSUDH campus.

The campus is strategically located in the heart of a major technological, industrial and transportation complex in Southern California. This area includes the massive Port of Long Beach and the Port of Los Angeles – Southern California's gateway to international commerce. The South Bay region is also home to aerospace, oil refinery, healthcare and automotive industries.
