Essential Duties

Teach four courses (or equivalent) each semester in credential-, graduate-, and undergraduate-level programs. Co-plan and co-teach with faculty instructional teams; provide leadership in developing and revising credential and graduate courses and programs; supervise candidates in the field; advise candidates in culminating experiences; and teach and develop other courses in areas of specialization. The teaching schedule will include days and evenings, and may include weekends.

Additional duties include engaging in scholarly activities (publications, presentations, etc.), supervising candidates in fieldwork, advising and recruiting students, creating and revising program curriculum, providing service to the institution (including serving on programmatic, college-wide and University-wide committees), and providing service to the community.

Earned doctorate in Education with an emphasis on special education in mild/moderate (high incidences) disabilities. ABD candidates will be considered. If ABDD, candidates will be required to complete the doctorate by August 2018.
