- 1) An earned Doctorate (Ed.D. or Ph.D.) in Science Education or closely-related field with a strong background in science from an accredited institution is required; however, applicants nearing completion of the doctorate (ABD) may be considered. For appointment, the doctorate must be completed by the date of appointment (8/16/2018);
- 2) A minimum three years of successful experience teaching science in K-12 classrooms;
- 3) Demonstrated knowledge of content and skills in science;
- 4) Demonstrated knowledge of science education, including curriculum standards (e.g. Next Generation Science Standards, Common Core Mathematics), assessment, instructional methods that include use of technology, and curriculum adaptations, and;
- 5) Ability to demonstrate a commitment to working effectively with faculty, staff, and students in a multicultural/multiethnic urban campus environment with a substantial population of first-generation students.

Preferred Qualifications:

- 1) Experience offering teacher professional development, university teaching, and/or field supervision for preservice science teachers:
- 2) Knowledge and/or experience with language development or bilingual education,
- 3) Demonstrated experience with collaborative initiatives that support other teacher education programs that exist in the college, and;
- 4) A record of scholarly activity in science education, including professional publications in the science education field, presentation of workshops at conferences, and participation in funded STEM or science projects.

Duties:

community. These responsibilities generally include: advising students, participation in campus and system-wide committees, maintaining office hours, working collaboratively and productively with colleagues, and participation in traditional academic functions.

Teaching duties include teaching in the undergraduate Urban Learning major, the multiple subject and single subject credential programs, and in Master's degree programs, as well as supervise student teachers. The successful candidate will participate in committee work at the division, college and university levels. The successful candidate will advise post-baccalaureate students and work with colleagues from the division, college, university, partner school districts, and other educational agencies on grants, projects and other scholarly activities.
