Responsibilities

- Assisting the department with administrative work;

- Creating partnerships with University and area pre-K to 12 schools to place student teachers and interns;
- Expanding an established scholarly research and publication agenda pertaining to issues of Pre-K to12 special education.

We are seeking an Assistant/Associate Professor (tenure track) in the Special Education Department to perform duties that include: teaching courses in the Masters of Arts and Special Education Credential Program; advising and mentoring responsibilities; assisting the department with administrative and/or committee work; supervising students in Special Education field experiences; assuming college and university committee responsibilities; developing, establishing, maintaining and expanding a scholarly research and publication agenda pertaining to issues of moderate/severe special education; and soliciting external funding through grants and other sources.

The Ideal Candidate

The Special Education Department is seeking a colleague who shares their long-standing commitment to Moderate/Severe Special Education and to providing excellent preparation for urban teachers. The ideal candidate would be an experienced, credentialed Special Education instructor who has provided instruction on Moderate/Severe Special Education to graduate students and/or professional development to Special Education instructors. An established record of scholarship and/or grant activity would be expected, with a plan to continue. Collaboration in teaching and program assessment are essential. A willingness to assume a leadership role is preferred.

Oualifications

Minimum Qualifications

- Earned doctorate (Ed.D. or Ph.D) in special education or a closely related field of study from an accredited university by date of appointment;
- Must be eligible for, or hold an Education Specialist Authorization in Moderate/Severe Disabilities or its equivalent;
- Experience as teacher in public or private sector of special education of Pre-K to 12 moderate/severe setting;
- Understanding of urban education and commitment to the preparation of special education candidates to meet the needs of the diverse populations of Southern California;
- Demonstrated ability and experience in working in a collaborative multiethnic, multicultural, and multilingual environment;
- Proficiency in oral and written communication and interpersonal skills including a willingness to work cooperatively with both students and colleagues;
- Awareness of Common Core standards;
- Commitment to urban education and issues of diversity;
- Evidence of effective teaching strategies in both ground-based and technology- mediated learning (e.g., hybrid or online teaching experience);
- Ability to foster college-wide partnerships to promote quality in education;
- Demonstrated leadership skills in establishing and maintaining effective working relationships with faculty, staff, other departments, students and the public
- Experience in teaching post-baccalaureate and graduate students from diverse age, socioeconomic, cultural, and academic backgrounds.

Preferred Qualifications

- Experience with procuring and managing grants and other external funding to support research and/or operations of moderate/severe special education programs;
- Willingness to pursue a leadership role in the Special Education Division;
- Experience in mentoring new teachers through the induction phase of teaching.
