The Position

The faculty of Liberal Studies in the College of Education at California State University Dominguez Hills invites applications for the position of Assistant or Associate Professor (Tenure Track) in the Department of Liberal Studies.

The ideal candidate will be passionate about preparing the next generation of social justice educators, particularly to develop the knowledge and skills of culturally and linguistically diverse undergraduates and heritage language learners.

Responsibilities

- Teaching undergraduate courses in the Liberal Studies Department from a social/racial justice perspective across the major (from introduction to education to semior capstone).
- Engaging in appropriate scholarly research, academic conferences and publications in refereed journals;
- Advising and supporting students in the Liberal Studies Department;
- Engaging in service to the department, college and university through administrative and/or committee work;
- Participating in and expanding partnerships with community colleges, PK-12 schools, and departments across campus.

Qualifications

Minimum Qualifications

- Applicants must have experience in teaching undergraduates or post-baccalaureate teacher preparation programs especially with students from diverse age, socioeconomic, cultural, and academic backgrounds.
- Doctoral degree in education or closely related field of study from an accredited institution of higher education by date of appointment with a strong background in at least one of the following: elementary education, California history, STEM with a math focus, educational psychology, and classroom ecologogies.
- Three or more years of successful elementary classroom teaching in school environments with minoritized populations and linguistically, culturally, and economically diverse students.
- Research agenda or demonstrated scholarly work in area of specialization.
- Commitment to justice, diversity, inclusion, and student academic and social excellence.
- Demonstrated ability to use a variety of culturally responsive instructional strategies and methodologies.
- Willingness and ability to work collaboratively with colleagues.

Preferred /Desired Qualifications

- Successful experience in teaching/supporting bilingual/multilingual learners and first generation college students.
- Have a cultural sensitivity with knowledge of Native cultures. Functions and communicates effectively and respectfully within the context of varying beliefs, behaviors, orientations, identities and cultural backgrounds.
- Knowledge about social-emotional learning and creating trauma-informed learning environments.
- Knowledge of theories about teaching for equity and social justice and ability to integrate these concepts into content-specific courses (i.e. critical consciousness, CRT, humanizing pratices, critical pedagogies, etc).
- Knowledge of the Common Core State Standards, CA History and/or Next Generation Science Standards.
- Spanish/English bilingual.
- Enactment of linguistically sustaining pedagogies
- Depth of knowledge in qualitative, quantitative and/or mixed methodologies.
- Evidence of formal leadership experience throughout P-20 education through administration or teacher leadership, or chairing a department.
- Evidence of successful P-20 mexperise or experience in: elementary classroom teaching, administration or teacher leadership, inclusive pracrices for differently abled students, etc.

Employment Requirement – Background Check

Satisfactory completion of a background check (including a criminal records check) is required for employment. CSU will make a conditional offer of employment, which may be rescinded if the background check reveals disqualifying information, and/or it is discovered that the candidate knowingly withheld or falsified information. Failure to satisfactorily complete the background check may affect the continued employment of a current CSU employee who was conditionally offered the position.

The US Equivalency certification is used to validate foreign studies from an academic credential evaluation agency and is evaluated on foreign studies and deemed to be equivalent to degrees from the United States. The certification must translate the information in English, and confirm that your highest terminal degree is US Equivalent to a US terminal degree (i.e., Bachelor's, Master's, Doctorate's, Doctor's of Philosophy). About the University

CSUDH holds the Carnegie classification of Master's L and is a federally recognized Hispanic-Serving Institution. Class sizes are small as compared with large research universities and classes are taught by the faculty, not by teaching assistants. Many of the university's students are the first in their families to earn a university degree. While the university enrolls traditional full-time students, many students enroll part-time and attend late afternoon, evening, and weekend classes because of work and family responsibilities.

CSUDH offers 45 undergraduate majors, 22 master's degrees, and several certificate and credential programs. Enrollment exceeds 15,100 students, and the student population is among the most ethnically and culturally rich in the nation: 64.3% Hispanic/Latino, 13.4% Black/African-American, 8.5% White, 10.2% Asian or Pacific Islander, 0.1% American Indian, and 3.1% two or more races. Immigrant and visa students on our campus represent 100 countries.

The University is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC), the accrediting body for institutions of higher learning in the West. In the 2018 WASC Educational Effectiveness Review, CSUDH was reaffirmed for a full 10 years. Twelve programs hold accreditations from national professional associations: business administration, clinical sciences, computer science, education, health science, music, nursing, occupational therapy, public administration, special education, theatre arts, and social work.

The academic programs of the university are organized under the Colleges of Arts and Humanities, Business Administration and Public Policy, Extended and International Education, Natural and Behavioral Sciences, Education, and Health, Human Services, and Nursing. While continuing to emphasize the liberal arts and sciences, professional

programs offered at the undergraduate and graduate level, developed to serve the region's workforce needs, are of great interest to students and prepare them for professions in a variety of industries.

Faculty

A tradition of teaching excellence lies at the heart of the university experience for Dominguez Hills' students. Most of the faculty have earned doctoral degrees from prestigious universities across the nation. The faculty strives to sustain a dynamic teaching and learning environment in a multicultural setting. The Academic Senate provides a forum for faculty, administration, students, and others to be represented and consulted regarding such vital issues as budget priorities, academic standards, curriculum and instruction, and student affairs.

Student Life

At CSUDH, there's more to student life than the classroom. The university offers a dynamic, interactive, and enriching community of learners, teachers, and peers sharing diverse points of view. There are multitudes of ways for students to pursue interests, get involved, and get the most from their academic experience.

An office of student life enhances student development by coordinating a variety of co-curricular activities, including 60 student organizations. Students are encouraged to perform community service and participate in leadership development. The Multicultural Center on campus promotes the exploration of diverse heritages, values, and cultural experiences by offering a wide range of activities and programs throughout the academic year.

CSUDH is a National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division II institution that competes in the California Collegiate Athletic Association (CCAA). CSU Dominguez Hills is one of the most athletically competitive and honored schools in the CCAA, with 23 conference titles and four national championships to date, including the 2008 NCAA D-II Men's Soccer National Championship. CSU Dominguez Hills sponsors 11 intercollegiate athletic teams.

The Location

The university is located in Carson, California, in the South Bay region of Los Angeles County. Its 346-acre park-like campus is situated in the historic Rancho San Pedro, the oldest Spanish land grant in the Los Angeles area. The site remained in the continuous possession of the Dominguez family for seven generations - from its inception in 1794 to its acquisition by the state of California. The Region

The South Bay is one of the most culturally, economically, and ethnically diverse areas in the United States, with a largely even distribution of the population with African, Asian/Pacific Islander, European, and Latino ancestry. The university is located in the city of Carson, a city of 93,000 residents and one of the many municipalities that border the city of Los Angeles. Cultural, performance and sports venues in downtown Los Angeles are about 15 minutes away, and the South Bay beach communities are a few minutes away to the west and south. The Dignity Health Sports Park, a 125-acre sports center developed by AEG and home to LA Galaxy and Los Angeles Chargers, is located on the CSUDH campus.

The campus is strategically located in the heart of a major technological, industrial, and transportation complex in Southern California. This area includes the massive Port of Long Beach and the Port of Los Angeles – Southern California's gateway to international commerce. The South Bay region is also home to aerospace, oil refinery, healthcare, and automotive industries.
