The Division of Teacher Education at FPU is committed to preparing highly qualified new Multiple Subject and Single Subject teachers who are equipped to teach in the diverse communities throughout the Central Valley. The program is offered online to all students at Fresno Pacific University, including students in Fresno, Visalia, and Merced.

The Coordinator of the Bilingual Authorization Program will lead and manage the certification program, coordinating it with the Multiple Subject and Single Subject credential programs, at all three campuses, and will teach in the program. The coordinator will work with Teacher Education staff to develop partnerships with local schools and collaborate with educational leaders throughout the Central Valley. The coordinator will work with the Office of Clinical Practice to develop student teaching placements in bilingual educational settings, with a particular interest in placements in dual language programs and schools.

- Investigate the possibility of adding a Special Education pathway for the Bilingual Authorization, and guiding this through CTC approval;
- Consult with local school districts and Office of Clinical Practice in the School
 of Education to identify appropriate student teacher placements in bilingual
 settings, including Dual Immersion programs and schools;
- Develop partnerships with districts with a goal of establishing embedded program cohorts;
- Coordinate multiple pathways to complete the authorization including pathways for pre-service teacher candidates and for in-service teachers;
- Work with Traditional Undergraduate Spanish program to develop third pathway through undergraduate major;
- Recruit, onboard, support and evaluate faculty teaching for program courses;
- Teach courses and mentor student teachers and interns who are pursuing the BILA.
- Collaborate with Multiple Subjects and Single Subject Program Directors to admit and advise students;
- Develop, administer, and maintain the Language Verification requirement that all candidates for the BILA be tested both orally and in writing for the language competence. This includes test administration, recording, and reporting of this data;
- Manage all aspects of the credential program, including, but not limited to:
 - 1. Working with other Program Directors to schedule courses;
 - 2. Organizing and facilitating outreach events;
 - 3. Organizing and facilitating all program events;

- 4. Completing all program assessments as required by the divisional leadership;
- 5. Developing and maintaining the program's website;
- 6. Managing student difficulties in a collaborative approach.
- Participate in professional development opportunities offered by Bilingual Education educators and Teacher Education professionals.
